

## **AADPRT CFAS Representative Nomination Process**

The Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) <u>Council of Faculty and Academic Societies</u> (CFAS) that identifies critical issues facing medical school faculty and academic societies and serves as a voice for both constituencies within AAMC's leadership and governance structures.

Every three years, an open call for nominations is issued (self-nominations encouraged) for AADPRT's junior representative to CFAS. **Important qualifications include:** 

- Understands the importance of this role and can commit to three years as the junior rep and an additional three years as the senior rep.
- Has a good understanding of how AADPRT functions (ideally, a former chair of a committee/caucus or a member of the Executive Committee).
- Can attend CFAS Meetings (AADPRT pays travel expenses to attend in-person meetings)
  - CFAS Spring Meeting (late March)
  - AAMC Annual Meeting (early November)
  - Monthly virtual CFAS meetings
- Has served fewer than 10 years of their first faculty appointment

The AADPRT Steering Committee reviews the nominations and selects the representative using the following rubric:

- 1. The applicant commits to the six-year timeline | Yes/No
- 2. The applicant commits to attending CFAS Meetings | Yes/No
- The applicant has been actively involved in AADPRT (served on committees, etc.) | Five-point Likert scale (strongly disagree to strongly agree)
