

Call for Abstracts

Submissions accepted: 8/1 - 9/17

We hope each AADPRT member will seriously consider submitting an abstract for career-stage forums, posters, and/or workshops, for the 2025 Annual Meeting at the Hilton San Francisco Union Square.

The meeting theme is "Magpadayon! Leading and Educating Amidst Change" ("magpadayon" means "forging ahead"). The review committee will give preference to abstracts that reflect that theme and/or include first-time presenters and multiple programs. Submitters are encouraged to focus on trending topics such as AI, CBME, JEDI, Leadership, Cultural Psychiatry, Wellbeing/Burnout, Psychotherapy, and Psychopharmacology and include how the topic is relevant to subspecialty fellowships.

Presenting a career-stage forum, poster, or workshop is a great way to help all of us learn and grow as educators and leaders. Each submission is evaluated by the Abstract Review Committee/Program Committee with respect to relevance, content/rigor/evidence, and pedagogy/structure on a four-point scale and then overall.

Abstracts must be submitted electronically by a current AADPRT member (dues up-to-date). Career-stage forum, poster, and workshop abstracts are submitted online through your member account (click "Abstracts" on your dashboard). For submission tips, watch this video.

- Career-Stage Forums: Members may submit career-stage forum abstracts (except the New Training Director Forum) for selection committee consideration. Selected abstracts will be presented at the Annual Meeting. Forums are 90 minutes long with the last 5 minutes reserved for participants to complete the evaluation form. In the video below, 2025 Program Chair Chi-chi Cagande explains what Career-Stage Forums are and their key topics related to the meeting theme.
- Posters: Poster sessions allow authors to present and discuss original research and/or innovations with other meeting participants. Handouts are encouraged. If selected, a PDF file of your poster must be submitted to the Program Committee by January 16, 2025.
- Workshops: Workshops should be highly interactive sessions that enable participants to learn new skills and approaches. Workshops are 90 minutes long. Workshops may include short didactic input(s), but primarily utilize interactive techniques in small and



large group formats. Reserve the last 15 minutes for questions and discussion, including 5 minutes for members to complete the evaluation form. Handouts are encouraged.

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
